Thank you for your interest in attending Moravian University in Bethlehem, PA USA. Any student who is, or intends to be, in the United States on a Student Visa (F) is considered an international student. In order to issue the application for the student visa (SEVIS form,) you must submit the following documents:

First-year International students are required to submit the following

Undergraduate Students official secondary school academic records (original and certified translations) Graduate Students Official Transcripts (must be evaluated by CE or WES if not US based) from all institutions previously attended a professional resume, cover letter to the Admission Committee, Official GMAT scores Ask about your GMAT waiver option! (Visit mba.com for information about taking the GMAT,) two recommendations, and an interview.

Official Test Scores (SAT or ACT.) If English is not your native language, you must submit TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language) or IELTS (International English Language Testing Scores) scores, and this is required of all freshman applicants. Requirements may be waived for transfer students contingent on college or university transcripts. Please note that Moravian University does not offer an English as a Second Language (ESL) program.

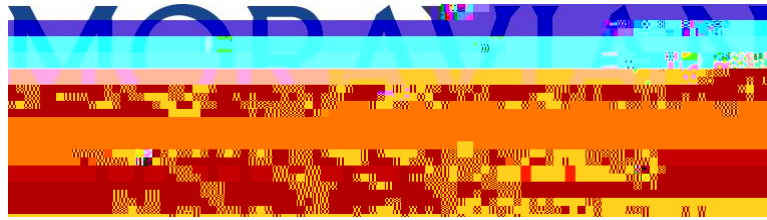
"Certification of Finance" form (included in application packet) that confirms that you and your sponsor understand the total cost of education and there are adequate funds for your educational expenses under normal conditions through the full program.

A letter from a bank official or bank statements must accompany all figures indicated on the "Certification of Finance" form for verification. However, all documents must be dated within 6 months of application.

Proof of Financial Support The Undergraduate student must prove that they have at least the equivalent of \$6,000 (US) readily available to them for educational expenses. The Graduate student must prove that they have at least the equivalent of \$10,000 (US) readily available to them for educational expenses. The money can be in any country and any currency. Acceptable sources of financial resources are saving accounts, checking accounts, money market accounts, and certificates of deposit. If Moravian awards you a merit scholarship, you may deduct the amount of the scholarship from the total.

A letter of recommendation from a guidance counselor.

A personal statement or essay.
